CSJAs Joanne Fantini, Joanne Murphy, Joanne Mauldin, Margaret Lelakes and Mary Rita Weschler offered a brief sharing of their personal stories. Each was deeply moved by simply being in the ancient 'kitchen', the central gathering space for the first sisters. Others spoke of personal spiritual deepening and inner pilgrimage. One associate shared her reflection on the courage of Mother Saint John Fontbonne and how she faced obstacles that confronted her with perseverance and valor. Sandra Selvarajah, CSJA, shared her experience of participating in a Mission Effectiveness program at the CSSJ International Center in Le Puy earlier in October.

Through the simple stories of those who traveled, a predominant theme of inclusiveness emanated. We are all journeying together and were carried in the heart of each during the Heritage Pilgrimage. Time was allotted for reflection followed by small and large group sharing. As a symbol of this connectedness, Joanne Fantini presented identical plaques of a Le Puy Lace Maker for the Boston and New Mexico Associates. Words sometimes are inadequate to express and embrace the full meaning of an experience, but Saturday's presentation offered a wonderful gateway to explore our own personal journey. CSJs Participate in Rally for Rebuilding Hope

Sisters of St. Joseph were among approximately 150 concerned citizens who gathered at Boston's City Hall Plaza and marched to the State House in an effort to highlight the need for communication between the City of Boston and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The march was in response to the closing of the Long Island Shelter Bridge giving the staff an approximate four-hour notice to find replacement programs and beds. It displaced 700 men and women in a state already severely short of treatment beds and shelters. Many are still in need of replacement beds. Some are unable to retrieve personal belongings, medications, or medical records.

A number of participants approached us and commented on their appreciation for our presence and the impact of the Sisters of St. Joseph in their lives. One Mount St. Joseph Academy alumna remarked that the values she learned at The Mount will remain with her for life. An alumna of St. Mary's in Charlestown said she follows Sr. Rose de Lourdes example every day of her life. A few legislators joined the group; among them was State Senator Mike Rush who spoke of his lifelong association with the Sisters of St. Joseph.

The message of the Homeless Rally for Rebuilding Hope was that unbroken, transparent communication, planning, funding and accountability is absolutely necessary and must start now in order to increase the number of treatment facilities and shelters as winter approaches.
